Daily Literacy

Reading

Do you have any stories about homes or houses?

The Three Little Pigs, A Place called Home, The Three little Wolves and the Big Bag Pig and Mouse House are good books to try!

Can you find things in your house that start with different initial sounds? What else starts with the same sound as your name?

Learn all about the sound “a” – what objects in your house start with a? Do you have this in your name? A is for apple and ant. What else can you think of?

Writing

Practise writing your whole name and names of people in your family.

Write labels for your house, these don’t have to be the word but can be initial sounds/pictures.

Practise drawing different lines, can you make yours bumpy, spikey, wavy, loopy or a combination!

Choose One Per Day - Communication & Language

Word of the week: **“construct”** – do you know what this word means? Do you know how to act it out? What can you construct at home?

Make a recording of sounds your child may be familiar with in the home, such as snoring, a kettle boiling, the TV, the bath running. Can they recognise the sound and say where in a house we might hear the sound?

Choose One Per Day - Physical development

Moving and Handling

Weekly Challenge! Can the children throw and catch a ball? How many can you do in a minute? A tied-up scarf is a good place to start when throwing and catching and then progress from a large ball to a smaller ball.

Make playdough together and exercise your finger muscles!

Can you sweep or rake the garden? Exercise your arm muscles!

Health and Self-care

Meal of the Week: Pitta Pizza Faces!

1. Preheat the grill. If you prefer, cook these in an oven preheated to 180°C, fan oven 160°C, gas mark 4 for 8-10 minutes.
2. Spread 1 tsp of tomato purée over one side of each pitta bread. Sprinkle with the dried mixed herbs.
3. Arrange the cucumber and halved tomatoes on the pittas to resemble 'eyes', halved tomatoes for the 'noses', the sliced pepper to look like 'eyebrows' and 'mouths' and the grated cheese for 'hair' or 'beards'. Place on the grill rack.
4. Grill for 4-5 minutes. Cool for a few moments, then serve.

Think of an exciting way to be healthy this week - maybe go for a walk, go on your bike or scooter, play football, eat a new fruit or vegetable. We would love to hear what you decide to do!

Daily Maths

Numbers

Number of the Week: All about number 1! Can you find one toy? Can you draw one line, one circle, one person, one house? What is less than 1? Can you show one finger? Can you find 1 in your house? Can you find a 1p coin? Can you find 1 on the clock?

Miss Webb’s problem: If I have 3 houses on my street, but I only want 1, what do I have to do? Build some more or take some down? Can you make Miss Webb’s problem using pictures or objects?

How many rooms are in your house? Can you count and record this? How many beds do you have? How many chairs?

Shapes, space and measure

Using the **‘Shape Cutting’ PDF** can you turn these into a picture of your house? If you don’t have a printer can you make your own shapes?

Play ‘I spy...?’ with colours/shapes/sizes

Use different containers and utensils from the kitchen. The children can explore the concept of full and empty by playing with pots, pans and plastic containers. Does one need more water than the other?

Choose One Per Day - Personal, social & emotional development

Think about why you like your house. How does being at home make you feel? Talk to the children about the different people that live in their home. Can they name the people they live with and listen to others?

Take a photo of your house. These can be taped on to the side of bricks or boxes so that they can stand up. Children can arrange the homes into streets and towns, as well as recognise their own home.

Choose One Per Day - Understanding the world

Complete the ‘Materials’ 2Do on Mini Mash.

How does your house compare with other houses in your street? What about other people/animal’s houses? How are they different? How are they the same?

Why were the pigs’ houses not strong in the story? Think about what your house is made out of. Pretend to be a builder! Use foam bricks and shaving foam. You can build walls and towers by sticking the foam bricks together.

Choose One Per Day - Expressive arts & design

Using a cereal or cardboard box, can you make a copy of a room from your home? You can use pictures from a magazine and stick them on. You can add toys or small objects from your house to use as furniture!

Draw a picture of your house and all the people and animals that live in it.

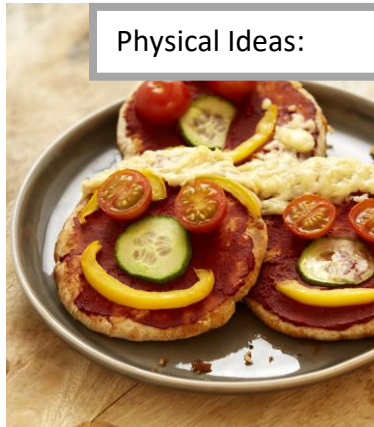

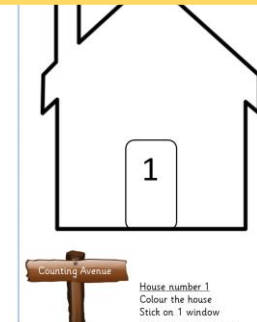

Step 1 - Once you've found a resource you'd like to annotate in the Twinkl app, download the resource on to your iPad or iPhone.

Step 2 - Once downloaded, a green tick will appear. Click on the icon to open the resource.

Step 3 - Use the Markup feature in the top right-hand corner to display the annotation tools. Use whichever colour or style you choose - you can also erase if you make a mistake.

Step 4 - To save the resource with its annotations, click on the Action icon in the top right. You can then save or share as needed. Perfect for sending completed work back to teachers or parents who want to check work.

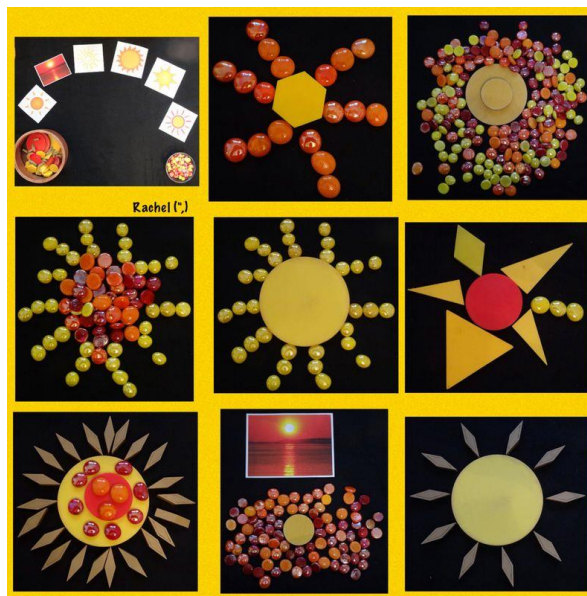
