Dear Parents and Carers

We are coming up to the time of year when many children succumb to all sorts of coughs, colds and other more unpleasant bugs and illnesses! As a school we are very mindful of what we need to do to keep the children and staff as healthy as possible. With this in mind the governors and I went through the school's infection control policy last week in an attempt to avoid the situation we were faced with regarding the norovirus at the end of the autumn term last year. Our cleaners, caretaker and staff do a fantastic job of keeping the school clean and as infection free as we possibly can and we would all very much appreciate your help by doing the following:

- Provide your child with a named water bottle so they are not tempted to share someone else's and ensure they bring it home for a wash every night
- Keep your child away from school for 48 hours after the last bout of any sickness or diarrhoea bug (as we found last year, many children seemed to be over the virus only to come back to school too early and start being ill again whilst also spreading the bug to others)
- Ensure you have signed your child up for the flu nasal vaccination if they are able to have it (the team are in school on Monday 15th October but you need to give your permission online first). The school is paying for the staff to have their flu jabs.
- Ensure your children always wash their hands after they go to the toilet so that they continue this habit in school. It is also useful to keep their nails trimmed so they do not become dirty.
- Encourage your children to cough into their elbow rather than on their hand—it really does help!
- Provide paper tissues for your child if they come to school with a cold (any donations of boxes of tissues for classes would be gratefully received). Please also teach your children to blow and wipe their noses properly and then to wash their hands.

Many thanks, in anticipation of your cooperation. Hopefully the Christingle Service will be able to go ahead this year and we will all have a happy and healthy December!
