Create an eco-friendly design for the school grounds. It could be an idea for a wildlife, sensory or mindfulness garden, a Forest School area, mini beast trail or even a wildlife-friendly vegetable plot. The opportunities are endless.

Pupils can design a garden from scratch or maintain and improve existing outdoor spaces. All designs should make use of the 300 trees or hedgerows to be awarded to the winning school, whilst also using natural and recycled resources in a sustainable way to encourage wildlife and biodiversity.

Pupils should consider the positive contribution the space will make to the school and the local environment. It's a great way to get the whole school community engaged in green issues!

Entries should aim to combine sustainability, originality, resourcefulness and learning. If you haven't got space to incorporate 300 trees into your space, you can donate 150 of the trees to another local school or community area.
