Dear Parents and Carers

As this will be the last newsletter before we break up for the summer next Friday, I would like to thank you all for your support over the past year. We have almost finished refurbishing the class-rooms in school and it is also great to look out of my office window and seethe freshly painted picnic tables, which were freshened up by a group of parents.

A few reminders for you ready for September:

- If your child is having their ears pierced, please have this done at the beginning of the holidays so they are able to take their ear-rings out for PE lessons.
- Haircuts should not be extremely short and heads should not be shaved, as these styles are not appropriate for school.
- Hair decorations should be small and discrete in school uniform colours and hair gel is not permitted
- School shoes should be black and of a style suitable for day to day activities in school. Trainers
 can be worn for PE and break times but shoes (not boots) should be worn at all other times.
- Only children who have passed their Stage 2 Bikeability Test whilst they were in in Y5 are permitted to ride their bikes to school unaccompanied. Any child riding their bike to school, even with their parent, must wear a helmet or they are not allowed to bring their bike onto the premises. Everyone (including adults) should dismount their bike or scooter when entering the school grounds, and not ride around the playgrounds either before or after school.

We have lots of opportunities planned for you to join in with different school activities next year and will be holding meetings to help you help your children with English and maths. I hope many of you will be able to make the most of these opportunities.

This Friday we are holding our final Open Afternoon from 2.30pm (Y4 children will be back from Tor Bridge between 2.45 and 3pm but will leave their books out on the tables if you arrive a little early). This is a chance for you to look at your children's progress over the year and to ask their teacher any questions you may have about their reports. Please note that you cannot use your mobile phones in school, and if you need to take a call you will need to do so outside of the school building away from the children. Any parents seen using their phones will be asked to put them away by staff. If you have finished looking at your children's books and seen everything you want to see, you may sign your children out from 3.15pm onwards. Any children who do not have parents at school will be let out at 3.30pm as normal.

I am delighted to announce that we have appointed Mrs Polly Betts as a TA in Y1 next year and Miss Michelle Luscombe as a TA in Y5 and Y6. They will both be visiting their new classrooms before the end of term and I know they are very keen to start their new jobs in September. At the same time we are sad to be saying goodbye to Miss Gardner and Mr Murphy but wish them both every success in their new adventures.

I wish you all a fabulous summer holiday and look forward to working with you and your families again next year.

Hungry Caterpillar News

Last week in the Hungry Caterpillar club we made beetroot chocolate brownies which were delicious, despite initial hesitance, they were enjoyed universally. The recipe is below: Ingredients

500g whole raw beetroot (3-4

medium beets)

100g unsalted butter, plus extra for the tin

200g bar plain chocolate

1 tsp vanilla extract

250g golden caster sugar

3 eggs

100g plain flour

25g cocoa powder

Method

Wear a pair of rubber gloves to stop your hands from staining, then top, tail and peel the beet-root – you'll need about 400g flesh. Roughly chop and put into a large bowl. Add a splash of water, cover with cling film, then microwave on High for 12 mins or until tender.

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. While the beetroot cooks, butter then line a

20x30cm traybake or small roasting tin.

Roughly chop the chocolate and cut the butter into cubes. Tip the cooked beetroot into a sieve, drain off any excess liquid, then put into a food processor or blender with the chocolate, butter and vanilla. Whizz until the mix is as smooth as you can get it. The chocolate and butter will melt as you do this.

Put the sugar and eggs into a large bowl, then beat using an electric hand whisk until thick, pale and foamy, about 2 mins.

Spoon the beetroot mix into the bowl (it won't look too pretty at this stage, but bear with me), then use a large metal spoon to fold it into the whisked eggs. Try to conserve as much air in the mixture as you can. Sift in the flour and cocoa powder, then gently fold these in to make a smooth batter.

Pour into the prepared tin and bake for 25 mins or until risen all over, with just the merest quiver under the centre of the crust when you shake the pan. Cool completely in the tin, then cut into squares.
