Beetroot and Chocolate Brownies

400g cooked beetroot; 100ml rapeseed oil; 250g good-quality dark chocolate (70% cocoa, dairy-free if you want, chopped); 3 large eggs; 200g golden caster sugar or coconut sugar; 2 tsp vanilla extract; 140g plain flour; 75g cocoa powder; 1 tsp baking powder

Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Grease and line a 20 x 30cm cake tin with baking parchment. Chop one-third of the cooked beetroots into small cubes and blitz the remainder in a blender or food processor to a paste. Sit the paste in a sieve over a bowl just to extract a little of the juice then mix the oil into the purée.

Melt the chocolate slowly in a heatproof bowl over a pan of barely simmering water and leave to cool slightly. Use an electric whisk to beat the eggs, sugar and vanilla together in a large mixing bowl until light, fluffy and tripled in size. Carefully fold the eggs into the beetroot mixture, followed by the melted chocolate. Fold in the flour, cocoa powder and baking powder, then add the chopped beetroot.

Pour into your prepared tin and bake for 20-25

mins. The brownies should still be slightly gooey in the middle. Allow to cool.
