Dear Parents and Carers

Along with this newsletter today you should receive the results of the parent questionnaire that 81 of you completed at the parents' evenings before half term. Thank you to everyone who managed to complete a form and I hope you find the results informative about the school. As always there is a lot going on in school this half term and I have added a few dates in yellow to the Key Dates column on the right of this newsletter for you. Y6 have decided we should have a **Mad Hair Day for Children in Need next Friday (16th Nov)** as we are also having a **chocolate mufti day the following week (23rd Nov)** to get prizes for the chocolate tombola at the **Christmas Fair (Thu 29th Nov)**. I am again encouraging your children to make a donation from their pocket money, if they have any, rather than ask you for money but I can't make any promises!
