Dear Parents and Carers

Firstly, a big 'Thank you' to everyone who supported our **Harvest** food collection and **Red, White and Blue Day** last week. We have been able to donate **three crates** of food to the local food bank which will go a long way towards supporting families in this local area. Our final total for Red, White and Blue Day was £152.82 which will go to ABF The Soldiers' Charity, the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund, and The Royal Navy and Royal Marines Charity. These are both great results for a relatively small school.

As the weather is getting colder it is important your children have **coats** available for play-times and lunchtimes. Please make sure they bring a coat to school every day and that **all of their uniform is named**. We would like to be in the position of having **no lost property** at all because we are able to return named lost items to their owners.
